

CASE STUDY:

Bolster Apprenticeship Pipelines with English Upskilling

Apprenticeships connect workers with jobs in high-demand fields and boost employers' bottom lines. Yet across the country, English barriers keep adult English learners — a talent pool that now represents 1 in 10 working-age adults in the U.S. — from accessing these high-impact programs. An innovative pre-apprenticeship program with Maine-based Lewiston Adult Education is closing the gap.

Lewiston's program connects adult English learners — who represent 57 countries and speak 43 languages other than English with a mix of career skills, English skills, digital literacy, and workforce readiness courses. Participants earn a series of industry-recognized health credentials, culminating in placement as Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) apprentices with area hospitals and long-term care facilities.

Lewiston tapped EnGen to bolster participants' career-aligned English skills and digital skills. The program is now expanding to the education and finance sectors, connecting more adult English learners with career pathways in high-demand fields.

We are thrilled that certified pre-apprenticeship programs, like the one at Lewiston Adult Education, are opening doors for multilingual learners and other under-represented populations to enter registered apprenticeship programs in Maine.

STEPS TO SUCCESS

Lewiston's pre-apprenticeship program is bolstering the local healthcare sector, placing more than 35 highly qualified candidates – all adult English learners – in roles with local health employers, with 28 more in the pipeline heading into the upcoming CNA class. Two years post-launch, all apprentices are thriving in their roles, a boon for a sector with exceptionally high turnover rates. The pre-apprenticeship program holds promise to scale to other communities. Here are three insights for other workforce leaders interested in replicating Lewiston's success.



1. Build cross-sector support. Lewiston's pre-apprenticeship pathway includes support from Lewiston Adult Education, the Maine Apprenticeship Program, and a network of six local healthcare employers that hire participants for one-year apprenticeships. Cross-sector partnerships between adult educators and employers are critical to ensure that apprenticeships are prepared for success in the workplace – and can access on-the-job training.



2. Prioritize access and impact. Lewiston's cohorts meet three days per week, giving participants time to work or tend to caregiving duties on off days. The pathway consists of three levels, each resulting in an industry-recognized credential. While a full 85% of learners complete the full CNA training, the program is designed to ensure that learners can get a full-time job after completing any of the three levels.



3. Recognize English skills as workforce skills. The pre-apprenticeship curriculum integrates career and technical training with other essential workforce skills, including English skills. Lewiston Adult Education has tapped EnGen to provide on-demand, career-aligned English upskilling to participants. With courses like "English for Certified Nursing Assistants," EnGen seamlessly complements Lewiston's existing curriculum and boosts instructors' capacity to offer personalized instruction to learners.

Lewiston Adult Education program has been a game-changer for our organization. The digital curriculum not only equips them with essential healthcare language but also ensures they are workforce-ready from day one.
